Cable News

Slowly but surely the plunge of the Ferman Crown Prince's armies is being halted by the French and British armies while the momentum of the enemy masses have not yet spent itself. There has been a notable slackening in its advance during the past day. The chief efforts of the Germans now seem to be devoted to the widening of the gap they have torn in the positions of the Allies between Pinen and Brimont. This work seems to be progressing slowly against the desperate resistance of the allied forces. The French having fallen back from the limits of the City of Soissons have stood their ground against the attacks of the enemy, and the German official report fails to show material advances there during the day's fighting. The French are here fighting on familiar ground which heen made historic by many battles, some of which are named among the decisive combats of history. On the east end of the line some of the forts before Rheims are said to have fallen which was to be expected from the fact that they have been outflanked by the tide of invasion that has swept far to the south of the city. The fighting has taken on the familiar aspect of the first invasion of France in 1914, the advance of Von MacKensen along the Dunajes and the fighting in Picardy in March after breaking the French and British defensive positions but not breaking the Allied line. The Germans are again moving their forces out in a fan-shaped figure, fighting hardest on the flanks of the extreme front of their advance. The situation while apparently extremely serious has not assumed the critical aspect of the fighting late in March. The Allies are resisting the enemy attacks, stubbernly giving ground when overpowered and always maintaining a solid front. The wave of the advance is now approaching the valley of the Marne, the nearest approach to that avenue toward Paris being at the village of Vessilv which lies at the extreme apex of the enemy wedge, and is about seven miles from the river. In 1914 the Germans advanced over a front extending from Braisne just east of Soissons to Vauquois a little west of Verdun. After having reached the Marne the enemy turned the force of their advance towards the west and they may be expected to repeat their tactics of four years ago. portions may be struck somewhere along the front of the German wave, or on its western side which seems to be open to attack which might crumble up the German armies to the east of Soissons. The Americans who captured Cantigny have beaten off attack after attack by the enemy. Large German forces are said to have been gathered to retake the village and have launched fierce assaults at the Americans, but the latter with rifle and machine gun fire have mowed down the Teuton waves while the American artillery smashed the German formations with barrage fire. Along the American positions in the Toul and Luneville sectors there have been many spirited engagements, but nowhere have the Germans succeeded in penetrating the American lines. The Allied positions in the Flanders sector have been subjected to bombardments, but the only infantry actions there have been initiated by the French near Dickebusch Lake, south of Ypres, who improved their posi-tions as the result of an attack on the Germans. The fighting on the Italian front has not been of an unusual char-

OUTNUMBERED FIVE TO ONE. FRENCH ARMY HEADQUARTERS, May 29. (Via Reuter's Ottawa Agen-ey.)—The most encouraging feature of the situation to-night is that during the past 24 hours the enemy's rate of advance has been very appreciably slackened. The enemy after taking Soissons, Arcy and St. Restitue, an average distance of two miles of his left. The British were ferced back in an angle of the Aisne, Vesle and Oise Canal. The enemy now surrounds Rheims on three sides frontally. The Germans continue to push in the direction of Fere-en-Tardenois, and are at grips with the French on the heights south of the River Valle. Our reserves are beginning to arrive on the battlefields. The Germans at present have a superiority in men of five to one. It is calculated they have engaged forty divisions and have another forty in reserve. It is quite possible they may strike another sudden blow in the direction of Amiens or Dunkirk. The problem for us is to so distribute our reserves as to be able to hold the enemy on both fronts. Just now the enemy's whole strength is in the battle between the Aisne and the Marne. Soissons was taken after fierce street fighting. The Germans reached the centre of the town only to be ejected by the French, who counter attacked and finally pushed back the Germans to the western edge of the town which is in fiames. The Germans succeeded in the first three days of the battle in cutting a heptahedron in our front, the four corners of which are approximately marked by Crecy, Aumont and Juvincourt, north of the Aisne, and Arcy, St. Restitue and Rheims south of the Aisne. During Monday the enemy advanced about six miles to the bank of the Aisne. On Tuesday he carried his front forward to a line of Bruys-Villers-Franqueue, with a maximum depth of from nine to ten
