Time is passing and, but a few more hours remain, for electors who have not yet voted, to deliver their blow to Coakerism. Then you will rest easy tomorrow night and be all the more proud when the general rejoicement occurs, that your vote was one of the contributing factors to the victorious out of which the rejoicement will arise.
