

A syndicate, headed by the Arthur Hill Company, of this city, has closed a deal with Pattee & Perley, of Ottawa, for 500,000,000 feet of pine on Ottawa River, at a reported price of \$800,000.

RIFLES AT LONG RANGE.

United States Soldiers Ordered Out in Wyoming-Fifty Men Already Killed. CASPER, Wyo., April 13.—Fighting be-ween cattlemen and shoriff's officers on one ide and rustlers on the other has been Casper, Wyo., April 13.—Fighting between cattlemen and shorid's officers on one side and rustlers on the other has been going on for a day or two, and according to reports at least 50 men have been killed so far. The most sanguinary combat is said to have taken place not far from Riverside, between the posse of Sheriff Angus, of Jones county, numbering 150, and a large party of rustlers, during which the latter are said to have lost 23 and the former 18 men killed. Many were wounded on both sides, but the number is not known. The fighting was altogether with rifles at long range. Sheriff Angus went to the aid of Fred Hesse and Charles Ford, who with 100 men had 50 rustlers under command of "Nat" Champion surrounded. Champion "Nat" Champion surrounded. Champion was killed in the fight. All the Platte was killed in the fight. All the Platte River towns are filled with ranchmen, who have been driven in by the rustlers.

Gen. Barbor last night received a telegram from President Harrison, stating that he had ordered the Secretary of War to concentrate a sufficient number of the soldiers from Fort McKinney, Wyo., to co-operate with the authorities in effecting a settlement of the present difficulties between the cattlemen and rustlers. The troops will lose no time in going to the scene of action.
