Tackaberry, George Mathewson, S. Wheaton, Jos. Wheaton, Mr. Allen and Mr. Maitland. The late Mr. Russell was one of the oldest residents of London, being born in this city in the year 1827. He was a life-long Liberal and a member of the First Presbyterian Church. The deceased is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Homer Jackson, of Calgary, Mrs. Frank Jones, of this city, and Miss Ida, at home; also four sons—Alf, in Winnipeg; Edwin A. in St. Louis; John W. in Denver, and Ethel M. of this city. Rev. Mr. Rollins and Rev. J. G. Inkster conducted the services.

Augustine Daly's Recital.
Friends in London will be both surprised and pleased to learn of the musical successes of Bertram S. McKenzie, now of Montreal, and a brother of Miss Agnes McKenzie, formerly supervisor of kindergartens and normal lecturer in London. Upon completing his collegiate course in this city, Mr. McKenzie went to McGill University, in both arts and science, and is at present connected with the C. P. R. at Montreal, in the capacity of civil engineer. Always fond of music, he only began the study of it as a pastime a couple of years ago. The "avocation" which he composes a charming light operetta, both words and music, "Cupid and the Summer Girl," which was put on recently at Montreal and immediately caught the popular fancy. Of the musical numbers "The Moonlight Song" is the favorite, and has sold unusually well. Both words and music are well written, very pretty and humorous poetry being combined with tuneful, original and catchy melody. WOMEN'S MUSIC CLUB ARRANGES PROGRAMME
