

#### PECULIAR FATALITY

Man Killed in Passing Over Platform as Train Breaks.

Syracuse, N.Y., Nov. 30.-John Flach, of Denver, was killed early this morning in an unusual railroad accident on the New York Central between Buffalo and Rochester. He was a passenger aboard the Twentieth Century Limited, and as he was crossing the vestibule between the Pullman sleeper and dining-car the train broke in two and he was thrown to his death under the trucks.

The rear part of the train stopped suddenly under the application of the automatic air brakes. William Wickes. conductor, rushed forward to ascertain the trouble, and upon the vestibule he noticed a felt hat. He looked down and discovered the body of Flach doubled up under the trucks.




