**WORKMAN INJURED
BY AN ELEVATOR**

Accident to Arthur Handbea at McCormick's Works Today.

Arthur Handbea, a young Englishman employed at McCormick's factory, was crushed in an elevator while at work there at 11 o'clock this morning, one of his legs being jammed between the ground floor and the car. His condition is not considered serious. His screams attracted the attention of fellow employees, who threw off the belt, stalling the car. Handbea was later removed to Victoria Hospital in the city ambulance. He has no relatives in this city, it is said, but boards on Dundas street.

A large part of the flooring of the elevator was cut away before the young man could be removed.

A MARINE LIFTING MAGNET.

A novel experiment is being made near New Orleans, where a barge load of keeled nails is being raised by means of a large lifting magnet. A load of cotton ties, sunk near Natchez will be next taken up, while a load of woven wire sunk near Pittsburg will be the third task.

The magnet used in the work is three and one-half feet in diameter, and weighs 2,000 pounds. It is dropped into the water, the current turned on and five or six kegs of nails raised to the lift. A derrick is employed for the purpose. The nails weigh 200 pounds to the keg, so the magnet lifts from 1,000 to 1,200 pounds each trial.

A great saving is being realized by the use of the magnet which could not be otherwise effected. Were a dredge used kegs would be broken open and much valuable material lost. In this way the kegs are raised intact and the nails are uninjured, except for slight rust. Between 85 and 95 per cent of the cargo can be raised. It is valued at \$45 the ton.

The kegs are raised from a depth of seventy feet. The cotton ties are strips of steel used in fastening cotton bales—Electrical Record.

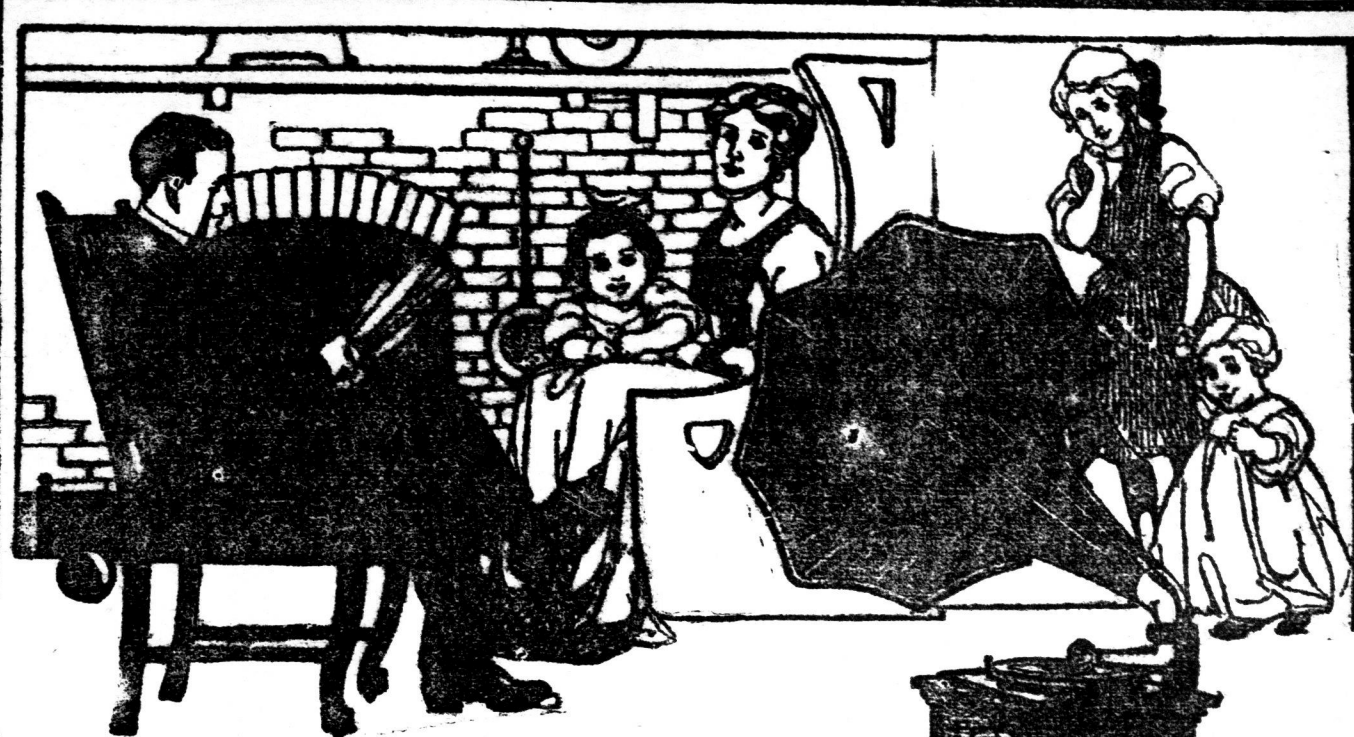

THE RAISED BEACHES OF ARRAN

The Island of Arran is one of those places in the west of Scotland where the geologic phenomenon known as a "raised beach" is very apparent. All along the coast there are evidences that the land has been considerably

elevated at some period of the world's history. One of these proofs is the presence of caves of various sizes, formed by the action of the waves in the past, but which are now well above the present high-water mark. The farmers use some of the larger caves as shelters for sheep in stormy weather. In a remote corner of the island one of these caves has been converted into a human habitation, where a family of several persons dwell in absolute seclusion. Their occupation is the gathering of whelks—an employment which is said to afford but a precarious livelihood. As the gathering of the shell fish can only be done at low water, and as the fishers have no boat or other occupation, they have ample leisure to enjoy the pure air and bask in the sunshine.

Except for the drip from the face of the high rocks above, which is still fully diverted, the cave is absolutely dry. The interior is shaped like a triangle, the floor forming the base. Save at the sides, there is ample room to stand upright and move about inside. Besides the beds and cooking utensils, the cave contains many articles of various kinds, giving the interior quite a homelike appearance. The apology for a fireplace is some way back from the entrance, through which the smoke finds its way outside.—Wide World Magazine.
