SARNIA TO HAVE BIG POULTRY SHOW

Lambton Association To Meet on the 24th of January.

Sarnia, Oct. 20.—The special train, which left Sarnia for Petrolia shortly after 1 o'clock today, carried a large number of local Conservatives to the convention of the Conservatives of West Lambton held at that town this afternoon. The delegates from here were accompanied by the Citizens' Band. They returned by special train at 7 o'clock.

Great preparations are now being made for the tenth annual show of the Lambton County Poultry Association, which will be held this year in the Sarnia Town Hall on Jan. 24, 25 and 26. A strong committee has been formed to canvass for special prizes, and it is to be hoped that the efforts of these men will be rewarded with success.

The executive committee of the West Lambton Liberal Association held a rousing meeting in the Liberal committee-rooms this afternoon, and decided unanimously to hold a convention, at which a candidate will be placed in the field to oppose Hon. W. J. Hanna at the coming provincial elections. The convention will be held in the town hall, Sarnia, on Friday afternoon, Nov. 3.
