THE ARROW IN THE PICTURE SHOWS THE REASON FOR THIS SALE.

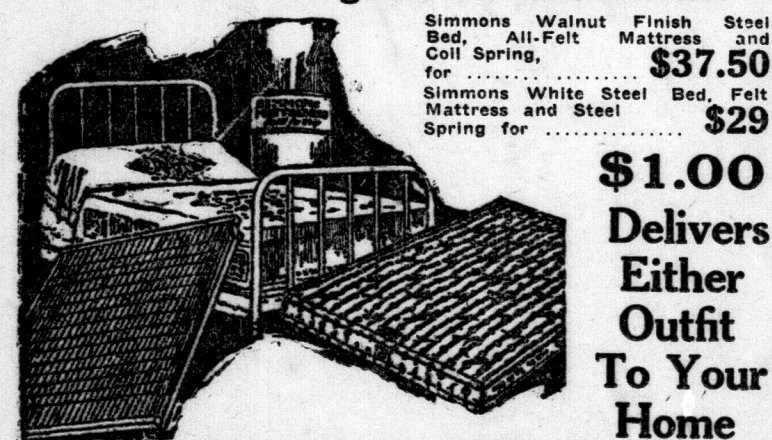

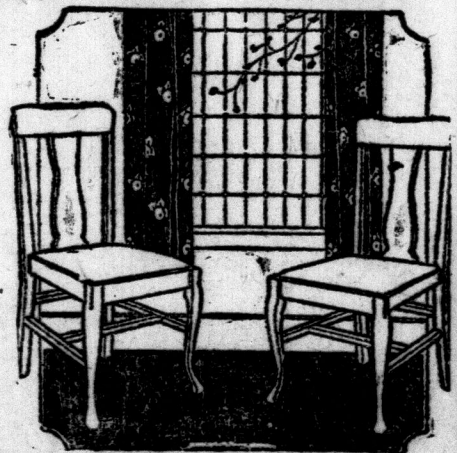

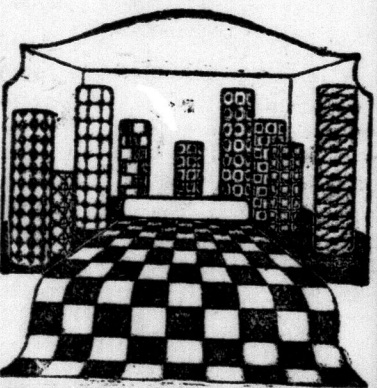

GERMANS OFFER FIFTY BILLIONS IN REPARATIONS

Stresemann Prepared To Meet Britain's Gold Mark Demand.

LEADERS RAP CUNO

Berlin, Sept. 20.—The German Government today awaited word from the result of its efforts to mediate with France on Germany's behalf on the basis of Chancellor Stresemann's memorandum of Monday.

The Stresemann offer contained three points.
One—That Germany will give up completely, immediately and publicly her policy of passive resistance in the Ruhr provided France will give assurance that imprisoned and exiled residents of the zone be permitted to return to their homes.

Two—Germany is prepared to go beyond former Chancellor Cuno's thirty billion gold mark reparations offer, meeting the British demand for fifty billions.

Three—German industry is prepared to admit 49 per cent French participation in the Ruhr industries. It is no longer concealed among leaders in political circles here that if the latest offer is rejected, Chancellor Stresemann will be obliged to capitulate unconditionally. All parties now represented in the government have within the last two days given him blanket authority to conclude peace with France on any terms whatsoever.

Finances Hopeless.

The reason for this relatively sudden change from conditional surrender is the recent revelation to the party leaders of the utterly hopeless state of German finances which Chancellor Stresemann inherited from Cuno. The true condition until recently was known only to a few.

The minimum needs of the Ruhr next week total five hundred trillion marks, or four million dollars. The Reichsbank cannot find the money. The last penny which can be sent to the Ruhr is being sent this week. The truth is that the reserves of the Reichsbank are much less than is generally supposed.

Already the demand is being raised that former Chancellor Cuno and certain members of his cabinet be called to answer for their stewardship before a court of justice. Cuno's hurried trip to America after his recent resignation is declared to have been in fact a flight to escape the consequences of his sins of commission and omission.

Reckless Spending.

The principal accusations against him are:

One—That he financed Ruhr resistance almost wholly by the printing press, it having been established that for several months less than two per cent of the Ruhr's expenditures was covered by taxation.

Two—Reckless expenditure of Ruhr funds, so that many grew rich at the people's expense.

Three—Encouragement, passive or perhaps active sabotage and other forms of active resistance, thus giving the French a pretext for taking harsh measures which eventually broke the resistance. It has been asserted by one respectable public man that the Cuno cabinet last April actually decided upon a general active attack on the French troops and attack on the only by the Prussian Government, which was under Socialistic influence.

MAYOR WENIG TO ATTEND DINNER TO LLOYD GEORGE

October 9 has been set aside by Mayor Wenig as a special occasion. He has accepted an invitation from the lieutenant-governor of the province of Ontario to a banquet at the Government House, Toronto, in honor of a very distinguished visitor, the Right Honorable David Lloyd George.

"You bet I'm going to attend," his worship stated as he read his invitation. "Lloyd George is a regular fellow. He worked his way up from nothing."

The mayor's invitation follows: "The lieutenant-governor of Ontario requests the pleasure of your company at the Government House, Tuesday, October 9, to the second round of meeting the Rt. Hon. David Lloyd George."

CO-PARTNERSHIP SCHEME SUCCESSFUL IN ONE PLANT

London, Sept. 20.—Co-partnership schemes, which were strongly criticized recently by the trades union congress as impairing trade union solidarity, have lamentably failed to fulfill the promoters' hopes of a few years ago. It is admitted; but where others have failed, Viscount Leverhulme claims to have brilliantly succeeded.

Viscount Leverhulme stated that 16,000 employees of Lever Bros. works at Port Sunlight held £2,500,000 preferential partnership certificates, an average of 128 apiece. Dividends are being paid to hundreds of employees, according to his lordship, of over 30 shillings a week, not to mention free life insurance policies totaling £1,000,000.

MINNEAPOLIS YOUTH DIES IN AMATEUR BOXING BOUT

Minneapolis, Minn., Sept. 20.—Walter Gretchel, 18-year-old boxer, died in the ring at an amateur football club benefit show here last night. He fell to the floor in the second round of his bout with Conrad Becklund, 20, and died within a few minutes. Witnesses differed in their stories to the police. Some said Gretchel went down without being hit. The coroner will conduct a post-mortem examination today.

MAYOR AND ALDERMEN TO ATTEND.

The South London Athletic Club stages its opening October 2. Mayor Wenig will be in attendance and several of the council, have also promised to be by the ringside. Ald. Douglass wanted to know if any of the councillors proposed to stage preliminary bouts, and when the mayor said he supposed it would be all right Ald. Watt said he'd go a couple of rounds with Ald. Wilson.

LONDON BANK CLERK WINS WILKIE PRIZE

W. Lyon Aiken, Now in Toronto, Gets \$100 Scholarship For Essay.

The D. R. Wilkie scholarship competition held each year by the Canadian Bankers' Association has been won this year by an old London boy, W. Lyon Aiken, at present with the Molsons Bank in Toronto. The prize of \$100 has just been forwarded by the manager of the Toronto office of the Imperial Bank of Canada to Mr. Aiken. The competition consists of an essay on "The Minor Profits and Their Importance, Together With the Best Methods of Collection." The winner, who was with the Molsons Bank when he was in London, was a pupil in the London Collegiate, where he was both popular with his fellow students and well liked by his teachers, who knew him as a thoughtful and careful worker up all his studies.

DANIEL MOWATT DIES.
