LONDON, May 22.—Dispatches from Rome state that the Pope has united with the Roman Catholic Bishop of the United States to raise 1000 volunteers for the Papal army, authorizing them to make such terms with the authorities as may be considered necessary and proper.

LONDON, May 22.—The dispatch concerning the result of the movement on the question of Scotch Reform in House of Commons last night was incorrect. The following is the correct report: Mr. Baxter, member for Montrose, on Monday night moved for an amendment to the Scotch Reform Bill, that the number of Scotch members of the House of Commons be increased by taking the franchise from some of the small English boroughs.

LONDON, May 22.—The amendment which was opposed by the Ministry on Monday night, but carried on a division, was last night accepted. The Premier subsequently proposed, on the part of the Ministry, a new clause, that persons excused from payment of rates by reason of their property shall not be entitled to vote. Further consideration of the bill was then postponed.

LONDON, May 18.—This morning's Post considers the vote on the eleventh article a conclusive result in favor of the Democrats, and of folly on the part of radicals, as it was the only exercise for taking such steps. After all, if right, it is indicated that the result is due to accident.
