London, April 14.—The Evident Tenants' bill will be introduced next Thursday. The bill proposes the re-enactment and extension of the scope of the section of the Act encouraging voluntary arrangements between landlords and tenants and provides that, in the event of the failure of the landlord and tenant to come to terms, the land commission has power to purchase the holding and re-let it to the tenant.

Registration, But No Distribution. That the Registration bill will be passed in the shape in which it is introduced, is absolutely certain, and it is equally plain that the framers of the bill did not expect it would be the subject of any serious discussion.
