2. If so, how many agreements?
3. Were tenders or bids called for in all cases?
4. Were tenders or bids received from the Imperial Oil Company Limited?
5. Was the highest tender or bid accepted in each case?

By Mr. Knowles:—1. What was the total amount of printing, by dollar value, done under the authority of the King's Printer during the year 1951?

2. How much of this was done at the Government Printing Bureau?
3. How much was let out to private printing firms?
4. With respect to the amount let out to private printing firms, to what firms were printing contracts let?
5. What was the amount of printing, by dollar value, let to each of the above firms during 1951?
6. Which of the above printing firms are authorized to use the union label of an Allied Printing Trades Council?

By Mr. Coldwell:—Order of the House for a statement showing particulars of enemy-owned patents held by the Custodian of Enemy Property as a result of the last war and subsequently disposed of by the government, together with the names of purchasers of such patents and prices at which they were disposed of.

By Mr. Argue:—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for a copy of all letters, telegrams, memorandum and other documents exchanged between the Government of Canada, or any Department or Agency thereof, and the Government of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool, the Saskatchewan Federation of Agriculture and The Saskatchewan Farmers' Union, between September 1, 1951 and February 28, 1952, in regard to methods of providing financial assistance to farmers with unharvested or undelivered grain.
