projects, such as CFC phase-out, reforestation, strengthening of institutions in developing countries and energy conservation and efficiency improvement.

CONCLUSION

The Dutch are very concerned about the potential for global warming. Given the very serious risks involved, the Dutch govenment stresses the importance of immediate action. Unilateral action has been taken, involving substantial financial sacrifice: until 1994 an additional amount of about US\$ 1000 per person will be spent on environmental programs, out of which about 20% is related to global warming. An international convention on global warming is vigorously pursued by the Dutch government, because only through cooperation of all countries this problem can be addressed effectively.
