RAID ON MAGAZINE DISTRIBUTOR IN THE TORONTO AREA

Question No. 35—**Mr. Orlikow:**

1. Did the RCMP, in co-operation with Metro Toronto Police during 1969, make a raid on a magazine distributor in the Toronto area armed with a Writ of Assistance and, if so (a) on what date did this take place (b) under provision of which Act was the Writ of Assistance used?

2. Were charges under the Act for which the Writ of Assistance was used laid against the magazine distributor and, if not, were charges laid under any other Act?

3. Was a large quantity of magazines seized on the occasion of the raid, and, if so, what was the wholesale or retail value of the seized magazines?

4. (a) How long were the magazines, seized through the use of the Writ of Assistance, kept by the police (b) were they held by the RCMP or the Toronto police?

5. Were representations made by the magazine distributor or his legal counsel for return of the magazines and, if so (a) when and how long before they were actually returned (b) for what reasons were the magazines held for the length of time they were held?
