- 1. What is a brief description of the facilities at the Customs and Excise College at Rigaud, Quebec maintained by the Department of National Revenue?

The Customs and Excise College, located at Rigaud, Quebec, is a departmental training centre dedicated to the training and development of Customs and Excise officers. At present, the College has ten classrooms, 14 syndicate rooms and a residence capacity for 127 students enrolled in basic recruit, technical and management training programs.
