I think he should take steps, thronch you, to zssure himelif of that support before opinion becomes too oritical, - and I camot inpress upon you too much the fact thet it is becoming extremely critical. There are any number of the best young men of this country, men whon pou ean readily guess, tho are your friends, and ghom you know are morthy of every trust and confidence, men tho will not abuse your friendshipy men who are Conservative, and, above all thines, not radical, - and the se men are shakine. thoir heade vory erievousiy at the present state of affairs. They do not think for a moment that any othor govermont mould have Cone any befter than the present government, and they are wil1ing to believe that no other govornment would have done as well. They know the principal causes of aistress in danede arise from comations outbite of Genebe, conditions in thich cankia is included and by which te are affected. But, they ard not satiafied.

He British people believe in Democratic Covernmont; that is, we have ereat roapect for parliamentery euthority. Yot ithis fe it thet our present parifement is about tro yours Bohind in its appreciation of whet the public is thiniting. The people ere heartily alck of the politheal prejultee thet exists, and that coverns the decision in most ceses. People heto $2 i t+2$, or $\pi 0$ sympethy $\pi i t h$ the oppositiot, who try to ombarrase the government at every tura, who think they have the conservative party on the rum and are not going to change their attitude until that party is puehed ovez the preeiplee. To them it epperent $1 y$ makes 1ittie differenee whet heppens to the country as long as they cen turin the voters ageinst the government and, as they believe, of coureo, in farour of the opposition.

I went before an academie body in Ottawa - the ottawe Yalley craduates of Mecil1 Wniversity - and made on academie plea for netionel covernment I sefe thet I wee not ei roetinc my remarks againat any party or against any men, but in a time of orisia like thia I felt there was mo place for perty coverament. Hy ploa did zot please any of the politiciens, but it ploased w wonderful number of people in videly different parts of Canade, who are cettims a ifttie tired of the ezhititfon of party govermment wo are now witnessine.

I had an laea that the formation of such a governmont would heed off the support which the C.C.F. Fould be likely to get if an eleetton trere eallea now. the d. C. P. is growing. It lacks atrong leaders, but poople turn out in the ir thousands to 11 sten to what euch ieaders as they pospess have to say.
