MacBrien, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., Commissioner, Royal Canadian Mounted Police, in which I asked for the co-operation of his force in helping the Department of Parasitology and Helminthology at Macdonald College, McGill University, to make a larger contribution to the solution of those problems with which that Institute can deal. In his reply, General MacBrien suggested that I write to you, as Commissioner for the Territories, in order that you might bring before your Council for decision such policies as might be inaugurated. I am forwarding with this letter an appreciation of what the Institute of Parasitology has in mind, and I suggest that if you are willing Professor T. W. Cameron, Director of the Institute, proceed to Ottawa for consultation with you. McGill University will regard it as a favour if you will consent to discuss this matter with Professor Cameron.
