

"BOSS" MURPHY IS NOT YET SUBDUED

Would Prevent Appointment of Malone as Collector at New York.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—(Can. Press.)—The rank and file of Tammany Hall heard today that Charles F. Murphy, their leader, was about to protest to President Wilson against the appointment of Dudley Field Malone as collector of the port of New York to succeed John Furber Mitchell, mayor-elect.

According to the report, detectives have diligently gone over Mr. Malone's record as assistant corporation counsel of New York with a view to learning whether he was absent from many weeks during the presidential campaign and thereafter. These detectives also sought to scan the salary rolls, it was reported, to ascertain if Mr. Malone had drawn pay for the time he was absent, should such absence be proved. "The findings," according to current political gossip, were given Mr. Murphy. Last night, the story goes, Mr. Murphy consulted several other high in the councils of Tammany and decided to put forth every effort to prevent Mr. Malone's nomination.

Mr. Malone is the son-in-law of Senator O'Grady, who is not at odds with the Tammany association. For some time past, however, Mr. Malone has aligned himself with the progressive element in the Democratic party.

BOTH EYES DESTROYED IN BELATED EXPLOSION

Employee of Belleville Rolling Mills Severely Injured Thru Dynamite.

(Special to The Toronto World.) BELLEVILLE, Nov. 11.—Thomas Cooper, an employee of the rolling mills here, was today the victim of an accident which in all probability will prove fatal. He was assisting in breaking up some large pipes, using dynamite. He had placed two charges which did not go off as quickly as he expected, and as he went to the pipes the caps exploded. Pieces of the pipe struck him in the face, maiming it in a terrible manner, and both eyes were destroyed. In addition, the right arm was broken, the hand torn and other injuries inflicted. He was removed to the hospital. Cooper has a wife and grown up family of nine children in Montreal.

TUXPAM ATTACKED BY REBEL FORCES

All the American Citizens, Numbering Twenty-Six, Reported Safe.

VER CRUZ, Nov. 11.—(Can. Press.)—All the Americans, numbering 26 persons, in the town of Tuxpam, which is being attacked by a large force of rebels, were safe this afternoon. Two American warships, the battleship Louisiana and the gunboat Wheeling, are riding at anchor in the Tuxpam harbor. Tuxpam is 145 miles north-west of Vera Cruz.

The U. S. consul here today received a telegram from the American consul at Tuxpam, Arthur A. Payne, in which the latter estimated the attacking force to number 1000 men. The consul said the gunboat Wheeling, which had been hurriedly despatched from Vera Cruz yesterday, arrived at her destination at 5 o'clock this morning. He added that the Americans in the town had not been harmed.

Rear Admiral Fletcher, in command of the U. S. naval forces in Mexican waters, received a despatch by wireless today from Rear Admiral Clifford J. Beach, on board the battleship Louisiana, which reached Tuxpam from Vera Cruz just before noon. The admiral said that 20 Americans had escaped from the town, leaving behind them six others whom he hoped to rescue, and, if necessary, take them on board his vessel.

THIRTEEN THOUSAND FIRE AT BROCKVILLE

(Special to The Toronto World.) BROCKVILLE, Nov. 11.—Fire destroyed the home of Arthur Smart at an early hour this morning. The occupants barely had time to dress scantily and escape with their lives. The dwelling is one of the beauty spots overlooking the River St. Lawrence, and the flames being fanned by a stiff wind in a driving snowstorm, the place was entirely consumed, together with its entire furnishings, which included such valuable personal effects.

Over and above the insurance on the building and contents, which was \$7500, there is a loss of fully \$6000. The fire is supposed to have originated in the furnace room.

DELEGATE WAS BARRED FROM LABOR CONGRESS

Tazelaar Named as Tool of Mulhall Who Served Capitalists' Interests.

SEATTLE, Nov. 11.—(Can. Press.)—The American Federation of Labor today refused to accept the credentials of Jacob Tazelaar, a delegate of the Painters, Paperhangers and Decorators' Union, and ordered that he be excluded from the floor of the convention hall.

Tazelaar was named by Col. Martin M. Mulhall, former agent of the National Association of Manufacturers as having been employed by Mulhall to work against the election of Representative (now Senator) Wan Hughes of New Jersey. Mulhall swore before a congressional committee that he paid Tazelaar \$1800 for his services against Hughes, whom the National Association of Manufacturers were seeking to defeat.

INVESTIGATION LIKELY INTO ABATTOIR SMELLS

Dr. Hastings Has Brought Nuisance to Notice of Provincial Board.

The abattoir smells of West Toronto according to M. O. H. Hastings, have not abated within the month he set. According to his promise, he has placed the affair before the provincial board of health, who have the authority to penalize.

"What will be done?" Dr. Hastings was asked.

He replied that an investigation would likely follow.

One of the penalties provided in the statutes is the suspension of the industry until the nuisance is abated.

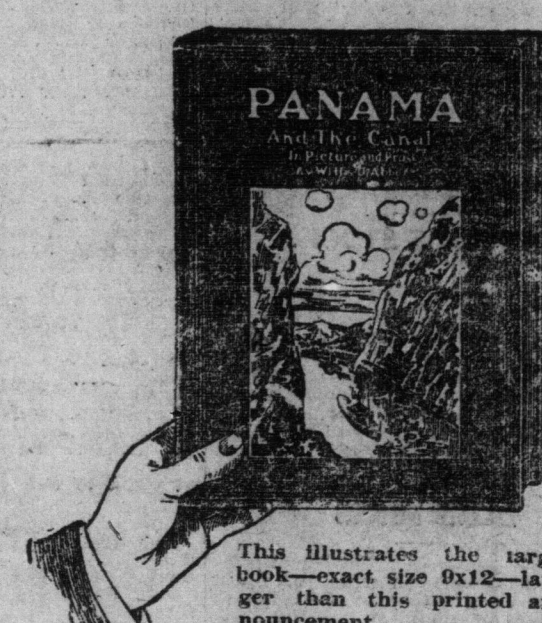
