Manufacturers and Wholesalers Speak Hopefully of Conditions.

LEATHER IN DEMAND

Embargo on Wool Exports Will Work Out to Advantage.

onto reports to Bradstreet's say that manufacturers and wholesalers merely of the future, but of the preont. Some there are who claim that this spring trade has not been equal to volume to last spring, some dry oods and hardware firms being mong this class, while other dry goods men, leather and boot and shoe ncerns, as well as grocers, state that trade has been better than last year with them. An order for 60.000 shoes of good quality has been distributed in Ontario by the Federal tributed in Ontario by the Federal Government, and arrangements are being made for an order for the Russian Government of 2.000.000 pairs of shoes, of a cheaper grade, also for Ontario concerns. Leather dealers are excessively busy. War orders in hands of, and coming to all industries interested in leather, and leather goods are more than making up for lack of ordinary orders from the trade. In this way they are able to stand indifferent to the trade that does not pay up. They are not losing ground. pay up. They are not losing ground, and their financial position is improving every day, as back accounts are paid. This touches every institution that has plenty of war orders.

Break in Wool Prices.

Wool prices declined 4 cents to 10 cents per pound at the close of last week, following the embargo on wool from Canada everent to mations of

from Canada except to nations of British connection. This was done for a purpose. All the wool the Canadian farmer has will be needed, and disinterested authorities promise better prices than are quoted at the moment. Some dry goods houses are doing more than last year, others are doing a little less. Deliveries from abroad are slow and rates are in-

abroad are slow and rates are increasing. The trade will have to turn to home mills for supplies.

In ladies dress goods, plain blue and gray patterns are in demand, and in men's goods, worsteds and woollens are especially popular. Stocks at big wholesale houses are getting low in the popular lines. Building materials are moving very slowly from wholesale houses, but spring and summer goods are going fairly well Grocery trade finds business about normal, but bad accounts are more numerous than a year ago. Cheese advanced a cent in a tight market. Butter is easy and eggs down a cent. Dressed meats advanced a cent per pound, and butcher cattle were up 35c per hundredweight over last week.

GENERAL WEAKNESS IN MONTREAL STOCKS

Business Light With Buyers Showing Disposition to Hold Off.

MONTREAL, May 14.—Prices sagged in all directions on the stock exchange today, but business was again so light and featureless that the market most of the time had the appearance of being stagnant rather than heavy or weak. Interest on the buying side has died away without bringing more than nominal amount of steels on side has died away without bringing more than nominal amount of stock on he market from sellers. The little that drifts in however, is sufficient to give a downward trend to prices, if prices have been displaying anything that could be called a trend just now. Only three stocks, Bridge, Iron and Scotia, contributed transactions running into three figures to the day's business here. All three finished lower, Bridge 1 1-2. Iron 1-2 and Scotia 2.
