### DETROIT CLASSIC FOR SINGLE G.

Indiana Wonder. Captures  
 Chamber of Commerce in  
 Straight Heats.

DETROIT, July 27.—The attendance to-day at the Blue Ribbon meeting was very much larger than on opening day. The track was in first-class condition and fast time was the order. Four races were on the card with the feature event being the Chamber of Commerce stake for 2,075 purses, purse \$1000. The largest field ever faced the wire in this event (13) started today, and the race was won in straight heats by a graduate of the blue league, or half-mile track, Single G., who was a sensation on the twice-around last season.

His time for the three heats was very fast considering that the weather was in the first heat. With very little delay they were given the word. Russell Boy, the sensation at Cleveland last week, drew the pole, but was unsteady and caused several false starts. Starter Walker gave him a chance, and the race was won in straight heats by the favorite, Single G., and the largest auction pool selling over the history of this classic was the result. First ticket sold on Single G. was \$1200, and that pool when the race was sold down amounted to \$2480. Single G. had the speed of the party and gradually worked his way thru the large field and won handily in 2:03 1/2, with Hal Boy second and Canela third. The second heat was a very hard race. Single G. seemed to be up against the whole field, each one trying to take a fly out of him thru the stretch. It was a battle worth going a long way to see between the favorite and Judge Ormond. For the last 100 yards it was a strenuous fight and both horses responded gamely. Single G. got the decision, time 2:03 1/2, last half in one minute.

### SEAGRAM YOUNGSTER NOSED OUT ARMINE

Surprised the Talent—King Neptune Captured Feature Event at Hamilton—Results.

 HAMILTON, July 27.—The Nursery Plate, the feature event of the third day's card at Hamilton, was won by Dr. J. S. Tyree's crack two-year-old, King Neptune. It was the first time this year that the juveniles had been asked to go six furlongs. Although there were only three starters the race was full of thrills from the rise of the gate until they reached the wire. King Neptune was the best of the bunch, but was soon up with the leaders. When they swung into the stretch Neptune was still in front of the other two. He gave three pounds to each of the other two. The time of the race, 1:11 3/5, was a within three-fifths of a second of the track record, and is the fastest three-year-old run by a Canadian in this event in the past few years.

The Galatine home bred two-year-old from the Seagram stable are beginning to show that they will be contenders for the King's guineas next year. Galt Day from this stable turned the tables on the Giddings filly Armine yesterday when he got up to win by a neck. Armine was still in front of the other two. Several looks offered three to two on the field against Armine. Armine tired after racing Hecla's Flame into the ground in the first half. Kathleen H., a forty to one chance, closed fast in the run home and got the small end of the purse.

After many unsteady attempts Schermer, sporting the colors of Norman McFarlane, managed to win a race. The conditions called for maiden jockeys, and Schermer, who is a Montreal-owned horse, was piloted to victory by J. Cullen from the Daily stable. George M. Hendrie's Scrutiny was second and Northern Light third.

Billy Oliver's Keweenaw at nine to twenty, made a runaway affair of the third race and won pulled up by three lengths from Yongeha. Yongeha finished the race in a very easy second. Martin Casca raced in second position most of the way, but tired badly. The favorite, Austin, added his second win of the day when McFarlane's Cliff beat him. Cliff was a very strong favorite, but he weakened. George M. Hendrie's Scrutiny was second and Northern Light third.

The "good thing" Water Lily, from the New York tracks, had little trouble in winning the sixth race. Brookcross and Josephina Zee set the pace to the stretch, where the winner easily passed them and won by two lengths. Josephina Zee was tired by the end of the race, and was outlasted by Martin Casca. The favorite, Encore, won the race on the turf after leading all the way by a length from the second place horse. Brookcross, three lengths in front of Carrie Orme.
