A Reply to Professor Alexander.
To the Editor of The Advertiser:"Ye shall know the truth,
And the truth shall make you free."

Nothing seems to hit as straight as the truth, and my writing must have been pretty well aimed to draw forth such a drastic and rapid-fire reply from Professor William Hardy Alexander, of the Western University, London. He has thrown down the gage about California, and all I want is what I feel sure you will grant, fair and reasonable space in the columns of your paper to reply to his extreme and unwarranted attack upon me; and I can prove that I know and think more of the charming State of California than Mr. Alexander does, or ever did.

It will be readily understood that the position of court reporter, which I filled there, gave me privileges not possessed by him, unless like the recent appointee to the Toronto jail, he was chaplain, or something in the San Quintin Penitentiary, where the moral (?) mayor of San Francisco is now "doing time" to the tune of a five-years' sentence.

I do not know why Mr. Alexander should jump at the conclusion that I was merely a "traveler" there, and I certainly consider that he owes me an apology for many of his remarks.

Now in the first place he arrogates to himself the defense of the great State of California, and incidentally brings in libelous references to the Japanese.

He shirks the main points of my writing, and the elevating and humane objects I had in view, and neither does it become the professor to moralize upon, or "curse," what he strenuously terms "the tremendous development of modern locomotion." He utterly fails to agree with, or even appreciate my claim that justice and British fair play are preferable to lynching, lawless interference, and mob rule, and he not only libels Great Britain's most faithful ally, and one of the foremost nations in the world, but is willing to see the poor Japanese abused, and even murdered, the proud boast of whose patriotic people, about their noble ruler, the Mikado is, that . . .

"For a thousand years successive,
Reins that same immortal line,"

and who, through their glorious victory over Russia, are almost justified in the trenchant remark so often heard lately in the street of Tokio—"Great Britain, but Greater Japan."

I want justice for these brave people, and if no one else defends them, I will, and that was my object in my writings.

Mr. A. evidently knows little or nothing about the high character, loving kindness, and lofty ideas and beliefs so jealously guarded by the brave Nipponese—from "Nippon," the ancient name of Japan. I can send him the Japanese National Anthem, and a finer, or more inspiring production never yet appeared in any language. Why, the Japanese are kind even to the lower order of animals, and here is a little story to illustrate this: An "observant traveler" in Japan asked a high official in Tokio, how it was that there were no associations for the prevention of cruelty to animals, such as are found in Great Britain and the United States, and even in Canada. The quiet reply was, "Simply because we have no cruelty to animals in Japan."

Mr. Alexander still prefers to believe that there is a "lake of fire and brimstone," and he presumes to say that he has some "inside" knowledge, whether scientific or superstitious, he does not venture to say. He uses considerable "latitude of thought" in cunningly avoiding that part of it. He must have visited the "Creation" sideshow at the Western Fair. He gingerly touches up the "small communities where Pharisaism flourishes, and is multiplied," and that is really the only part of his letter I can fully agree with.

When I refer to the State of California, it is entirely different to referring to the majority of the people who reside there. As a country, California is one of the Anest the sun shines on, and I know and love its 700 miles of coast line along the grand Pacific Ocean, its rugged mountain ranges, its big tree groves, vineyards and orange orchards, and greater than all, its sublime valley, the peerless Yosemite.

Without any attempt at self-laudation, please allow me to inform "my learned friend," Mr. Alexander, that he has "locked horns" with no superficial traveler or writer, and he will need to "play up, play up, and play the game," before he can say that he has covered the five continents, and traveled in every country in the world (except one, Russia, and "lived" in them all, and "lived" well, too. Even far away Australia has many redeeming points, notwithstanding its great handicap by being selected as an early convict settlement. It is known as "The Land of the Fern," and I often find myself repeating some lines of a favorite Australian poem:

"Dear land of the fern, dear land of the fern,
In spirit to thee I shall often return,
In slumber I'll rest on thy sweet sunny breast.
Though I wake far away from thee—
Land of the Fern."

Still I repeat the charge of immorality against Australia and California, for the countries where young girls serve intoxicating liquors over the bar, and where daily divorce courts, and weekly murder trials are held, are not good places for women morally inclined.
