# CHIEF, REPUDIATES THE SINN FEINERS

Declares His Faith in Goodwill of Britain.

DUBLIN, May 21.-John Dillon, the Nationalist leader, in an interview with the Associated Press correspondent today, emphasized the divergence between his party and the Sinn Fein, whose policy he declared to be "wrong and foolish and bound to end in disaster.'

Mr. Dillon said he still believed in a friendly settlement with Great Britain. He adhered to the declaration of the late John E. Redmond, made at the outbreak of the war, that the "cause of the Allies is the cause of freedom."

In an appeal to the American people, Mr. Dillon said the Sinn Fein had been supplied with unlimited financial resources from New York, and he urgently asked all those of Irish blood in the United States to support his party against the Sinn Fein.

## Turks In Mutiny and Forces Sent To Scene Desert

ATHENS, May 21.—Turkish troops at Aldin, in Asia Minor, have mutinied.
Two thousand soldiers sent from Manissa, 20 miles northeast of Smyrna, to quell the disturbances, have deserted. Numerous desertions also are reported from the coast garrisons. Repression of the movement has been intrusted to Essad Pasha of Janina.
