



#### M'DERMAND, U. F. O., CAUSE OF THE THREE-CORNERED FIGHT

W. G. Charlton Declares in Campaign Speech At Springfield Last Night.

SPRINGFIELD, Oct. 29 .- "As a Canadian citizen I have the right to run. I am not a criminal nor an insane person," said W. G. Charlton, Liberal candidate in the East Elgin by-elections, when speaking in the concert hall here tonight.

Mr. Charlton stated that he must have been misunderstood in his reply at Union on Wednesday to R. W. E. Burnaby's speech made at the U. F. O. meeting in Aylmer on Tuesday. "Mr. S. S. McDermand, the U. F. O. candidate, is the man responsible for the three-cornered fight, but I have no quarrel with the U. F. O. because they have brought a candidate in the field," declared Mr. Charlton. "McDermand was not indorsed by the ladies in the 1917 election, when he offered himself as Liberal candidate and was advised by his Conservative friends to secure homination as a U. F. O. candidate, which course he followed."

Who thinks the manufacturer needs protection? They have lived a life of virility. They are now old enough to stand on their own feet without any more protection from the state." he stated.

"There is a debt on Canada of two billion dollars, caused through the war. War services cost us a great deal more than it should. The Government of Canada was extravagant through its favoritism. They need not have paid such high prices for shells. The high price paid was what made war militionaires. It was not the shell manufacturer's falt; he was ofefred the work, but through favoritism he was paid an enormous price for the shells he turned out."

#### Last of Custer Band Is Killed by Automobile | LEMON JUICE

Prosaic End To Life Story Crammed With Romance and Adventure.

TOLEDO, Ohio, Oct. 22.—
Frank Fleck, believed to have been the last survivor of Custer's band of Indian fighters, was killed by an automobile on a suburban road here early today: Fleck, a ship carpenter by trade, had made his residence in Toledo many years.

When Custer's troops were mustered to pursue Indian renegades, he was attached to Reno's division. He suffered four bullet wounds in the battle of the "Little Big Horn" and escaped with Reno's troops, who had become separated from Custer.

Custer. Fleck was one of seventeen who enlisted from Toledo in the regular army of 1867. He was assigned to the Seventh Cavalry, which was sent against the Sioux Indians under Sitting Bull. Fleck was 70 years old.
