### Doyle's Usefulness Will Depend Upon His Arm.



NEW YORK, April 13.—Doyle pitched to the hard luck which had been just enough for the Highlanders in 1906 to give promise for the present season. His first game, in which he appeared against the Cleveland team, was much of a success. With a curve ball that broke with a snap, and that was thrown with tantalizingly baffling speed, he caused the hard hitters of the Cleveland team to hit everywhere except in the vicinity of the ball. Combined with some skill in the box, Doyle was the slowest moving position seen on the diamond since the days of George Cuppy, of Cleveland, and worried the players of opposing teams almost as much by his deliberation as he did by his ability to pitch.

Don McEachern, the local base ball player, who will play this season with Patterson, N. J., had a narrow escape from serious injury on Friday last. He left St. John on Wednesday night for New Jersey, and on Friday stayed at Boston to see the opening of the baseball season. Accompanied by J. Fred Shaw of this city, McEachern was sitting in one of the stands. At the close of the regular league game a scrub game was played. During its progress a foul was hit into the stands. The ball narrowly missed Shaw and struck McEachern on the head, knocking him unconscious. The doctor who examined him a short time after stated that had the ball struck an inch to the right or left the effect would have been fatal. McEachern is expected to be kept at Patterson this week.

COACH DONOVAN LAID AT REST.

Attended by representatives of nearly all of Boston's famous rowing clubs, the funeral service over the remains of the late Patrick J. Donovan, Harvard's former rowing coach, took place at 9 o'clock last Friday morning from the Church of St. Mary of the Annunciation at Cambridgeport. Interment was at Calvary Cemetery.

The pall-bearers were F. H. Whitten, A. K. Munday, who resigned the position of manager of the Queen's Rowing Club, and F. Folias has been appointed floor manager and instructor. The general management will be under the control of Messrs. Campbell and McKinnon, who intend giving their patrons and the citizens generally an opportunity of seeing some of the leading roller skating attractions during the ensuing season. Hon. Mr. LaBillois Presents a List of Bridges Which Will be Rebuilt This Year.

FREDERICTON, N. B., April 13.—At Friday night's session of the legislature Hon. Mr. LaBillois in supporting a bill providing for the erection of permanent bridges said it was proposed to rebuild the bridge between St. Mary's and Fredericton. Other bridges to be rebuilt were as follows:—

#### Madawaska County.

The bridge at St. Leonard's we propose to repair and partly rebuild at a cost of \$5,000.

#### Victoria County.

A steel bridge at Broad Way costing \$6,000.

At Salmon River, a covered bridge costing \$3,000.

At Three Brooks, a covered bridge costing \$7,000.

At Riley Brook, a covered bridge of three spans costing \$7,000.

#### Carleton County.

A bridge at Florenceville at a cost of \$15,000.

At Bath, a steel bridge on concrete sub-structure at a cost of \$75,000.

Charlotte County.

At St. George, a steel bridge at a cost of \$8,000.

A covered bridge at Young's costing \$5,000.

York County.

In addition to the Fredericton bridge there is the new steel bridge at Hawley costing \$85,000.

Repairs at Patterson's Gulch at a cost of \$3,000.

#### Queens County.

A new steel bridge on concrete piers at Chatham, costing \$40,000.

A covered bridge at the Narrows, Washedemoak, partly wood and partly steel, on concrete piers at a cost of \$38,000.

### DESIRABLE SETTLERS

Salvation Army Brings Splendid Consignment of Immigrants to Halifax.

Halifax, N. S., April 14.—The Dominion line steamer Southwark, the last Salvation Army steamer to come to Halifax this season, arrived this afternoon with 1,285 immigrants. The steamer had an uneventful voyage. The new comers are all English with the exception of a party of Dutch people numbering about 35. The immigrants are in charge of Colonel Rathwell, Staff Captain Patterson and Captain Vassena. The local Salvation Army band was on the pier, when the Southwark docked.

The passengers are the finest looking class of settlers landed at Halifax this season. There were 1,125 adults, 225 children under fourteen years of age, and fifteen infants. Colonel Rathwell says he has seen nearly all the Salvation Army people who have come to Canada since they started this immigration scheme, but this ship load surpassed them all in quality. Nearly every man in the party is an artisan and has a position waiting for him.

"England can ill afford to lose the people the Salvation Army is now bringing to Canada," said Colonel Rathwell.
