This morning the matter was discussed at a meeting of the council of the board of trade and the members agreed that such action would be proper in view of the fact that a public holiday has been proclaimed for the dominion.

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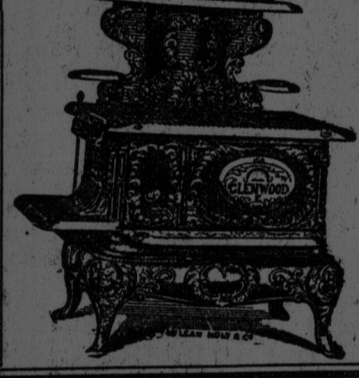
