## FLYING BOAT TO TRY A FLIGHT AROUND WORLD

(Canadian Press Despatch.)  
London, Aug. 4.—A date early in October has been provisionally fixed for a flight around the world under the auspices of the air league of the British empire, it was announced here today. The navigator will be Captain Timmins, now in charge of the air ministry's navigation department, while the pilots will be Captains McIntosh and McClellan. The flying boat will carry large supplies of petrol and will have several spare parts. It will be fitted with wireless and will have a 600 horse-power engine. It is intended to encircle the globe with the one machine. The enterprise, it is understood, will be officially and financially assisted.

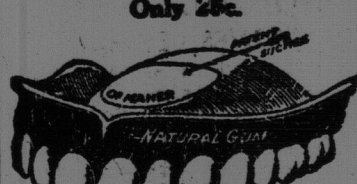

## THE GRAND TRUNK CASE JUDGMENT

(Toronto Globe)  
The Imperial Privy Council has rejected the appeal of the shareholders of the Grand Trunk against the award of the arbitrators who declared that the Ordinary and Preference shares of the company have no value. The appeal was taken, not on the justice or fairness of the award, but on the ground that Sir Walter Cassels and Sir Thomas White, acting as arbitrators, did not follow the course customarily followed in arbitration proceedings and permit the counsel for the Grand Trunk to present evidence as to what it would cost to replace the assets of the Grand Trunk Railway.  
The arbitrators decided—Mr. Taft dissenting—that the real question at issue was not what it would cost at the present time to build the Grand Trunk Railway, but what prospect there was of the railway—over-burdened as it was with debt, from which there could be no escape except through the Bankruptcy Courts of Canada and the United States—paying dividends upon its Ordinary and Preferred shares. If there was no prospect of dividends it followed that the shares were of no value.  
The judgement of the Imperial Privy Council is in effect an endorsement of this method of arriving at the award. Had the Law Lords, among whom on this occasion is the Lord Chancellor, be-

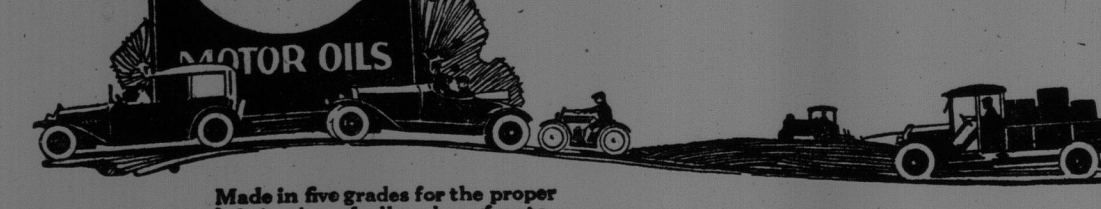

## Royal Roumanian Consulate General

NOTICE—The following is published for the information of all concerned.

1. On the 26th July instant, the delay expires regarding the option for Hungarian Nationality, foreseen by Art. 63 of the Trianon Treaty and by the Art. 4, Minorities Treaty.

2. On the 4th September next, the delay ceases for the renunciation to the Roumanian Nationality fixed by Art. 4, Minorities Treaty.

3.—All Roumanians of which mention is made in Art. 64 of the Treaty of Trianon, although the delay may have expired, can benefit if they express their desire to do so by writing, of Art. 9 of the Roumanian Constitution, and can proceed to Roumanian Territory whilst benefiting of the dispositions of Art. 63 concerning real estate and other property.

Declarations and renunciations should be forwarded to this consulate by registered mail before the expiration of the above dates.

there was an equity of \$48,000,000 in the railway for the shareholders.

The refusal of the Canadian Government to accept this appraisal led to the publication of many abusive articles in the British financial Press. It was said that the people of Canada were robbing and swindling the Grand Trunk shareholders and that the financial sharp practice of the Government were on a par with those of the less scrupulous States of Central and South America. The threat was made that if justice was not done Canada would find it difficult in the future to place loans in the United Kingdom. The judgement of the Privy Council proves that this abuse was entirely unwarranted, and that by assuming the obligations of the Grand Trunk on debenture stock to the amount of \$19,000,000 and on guaranteed stock to the par value of \$12,000,000 the people of Canada paid full value for the property taken over from the Grand Trunk Railway.

The London financial papers will now have to turn their guns on the British Privy Council. Are Lord Birkenhead and his colleagues parties to the robbing and swindling of the shareholders of the Grand Trunk? To that question there can be but one answer. They found be-
