FAMOUS INDIAN DIES.
Moraviantown, Ont., Feb. 20.—(Gen. Stonefish, Canada's most noted Indian sniper, for three years in France, was found frozen to death the other night near his home on the reserve. Stonefish's dead body was discovered by neighbors and the belief is that he was overcome in his exertion in wading through the huge drifts near his home.

COOKERY COLUMN
COCOA FRUIT BREAD
1 cup sugar
2 1/2 cups Graham flour
1/2 cup Cocoa
1/2 cup shortening
1/2 cup walnuts
1/2 cup raisins
1/2 cup molasses
1/2 cup baking powder
1 cup milk
1 cup vanilla
1. Mix and sift dry ingredients.
2. Add molasses, melted.
3. Add fruit and nuts, folded.
4. Turn into greased and floured pan.
5. Bake in a moderate oven twenty minutes.

COCOA BROWNIES
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup Cocoa
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1 cup flour
1/2 cup chopped nuts
Mix as for cake; spread batter on buttered tin as thinly as possible; sprinkle very finely chopped nuts on top. Bake in very moderate oven till lightly browned. Cut in finger shapes before removing from pan.

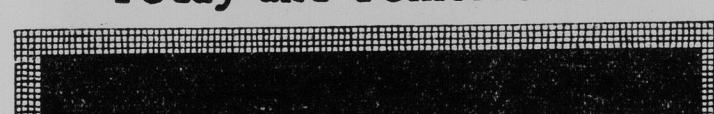

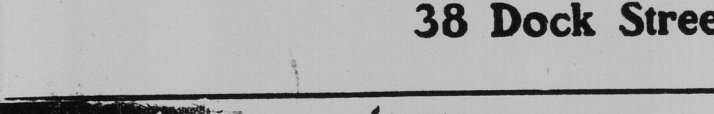
