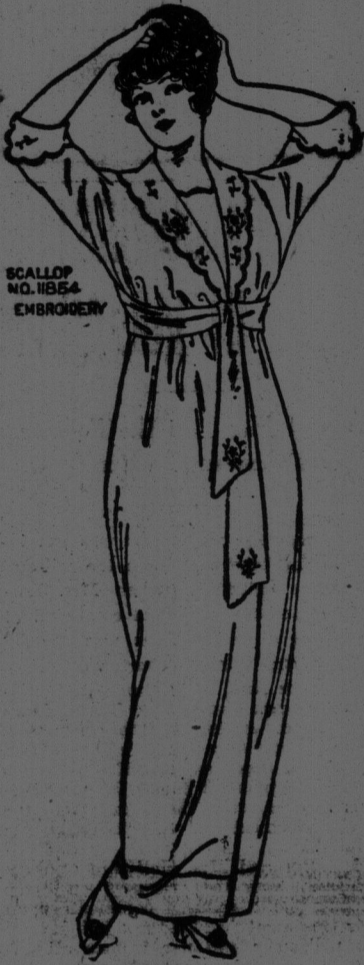

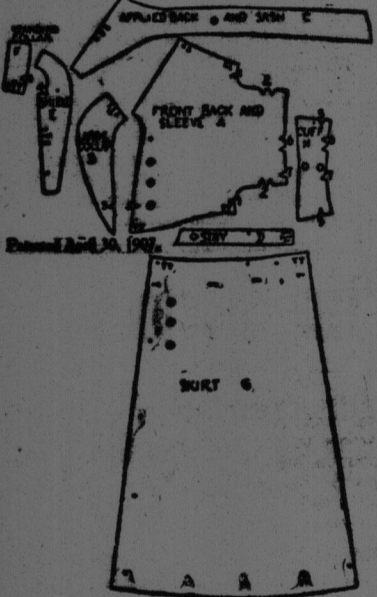

Proceeding with the construction, the under-arm and sleeve seams of the waist are first closed. Then the lower edge is gathered to fit into the stays which is then sewed on to the waist. At this point adjust the applied bias to position on the back, the centers even; stitch neck edges together; then sew the large collar to the neck edge. If the skirt is to be used, add the standing collar; then adjust skirt into place, bringing corresponding small "o" perforations in skirt and in front together, centers even. Close cuff seam as notched to small "o" perforation, saw to sleeve as notched.

DIVORCES ARE GRANTED IN FOUR CASES

Fredericton, July 7.—Judge McKeown this afternoon in the divorce court granted a decree dissolving the marriage and annulling the marriage between the plaintiff and defendant in suit of Edna L. Waring vs. George H. Waring. Defendant is ordered by the court to pay \$800 a year to the plaintiff as permanent alimony in monthly installments of \$66, upon first Friday of each month beginning in August. Defendant is also to pay the costs. The parties to the case reside in St. John. Two sons, aged 8 and 9 years, are being brought up by the plaintiff. Francis Kerr was the proctor.

In the suit of Edgar Case vs. Eva Case, P. A. Guthrie, proctor, an absolute divorce was granted. The defendant to pay costs. This suit was from Sunbury county. His honor in giving judgment, referred to the fact that he had stated while the case was being heard that he believed that the two alleged co-respondents who testified to the wife's infidelity were perjuring themselves. He stated that he granted the decree of divorce entirely on the evidence of Mrs. Nicholas Cochrane.

St. John grounds were alleged in all cases. Court adjourned to meet in St. John, Aug. 14.
