NOTRE DAME INSTITUTION.

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Six Sisters. At present 40 young ladies boarding, em-
ployed in the city at different occupations. One attend-
ing Normal school. Three female servants employed in
the Institution.

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Each of these schools (which form the intermediate
link between the Common schools and the Universities),
is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed jointly by
the county and town councils. In cities the trustees are
all appointed by the city council, except where there is
only one school in the county. The head master must
be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless

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
