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Cross-examined by the Prosecutor.

Q. Did you absent yourself without leave from 2200 hours on the 29th of April, 1945?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you remain absent until you surrendered yourself to the military authorities at Calgary Alberta at 0640 hours on the 5th of July, 1945?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. What type of leave were you on prior to absenting yourself?

A. Draft leave, sir.

Q. Draft leave?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Were you warned for a special duty?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you sign a draft warning order?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you realize the contents of that order?

A. I did sir.

Q. Well, you knew then that if you didn't report back at the expiration of your leave you would be classified as a deserter.

A. Yes, sir.

Q. How long have you been in the army?

A. Four years last May, sir.

Q. Did you know that N.R.M.A. personnel were being sent overseas as reinforcements for active units?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Did you work for any outside source while you were absent?

A. No, sir.

The Defending Officer declines to re-examine.

Questioned by the Court.
