And as President of this Synod I may perhaps be allowed to express the feelings of the Lower House, as well as of my Right Reverend Brethren of the Upper House, if I now in your name invite the distinguished members of the Delegation from the General Convention to take their seats with us on this platform.

It only remains for me to commend your Deliberations, and your several Synodical acts, to the over-ruling guidance of God, in the earnest hope that they may greatly conduce to the increase and prosperity of the Kingdom of His dear Son.
