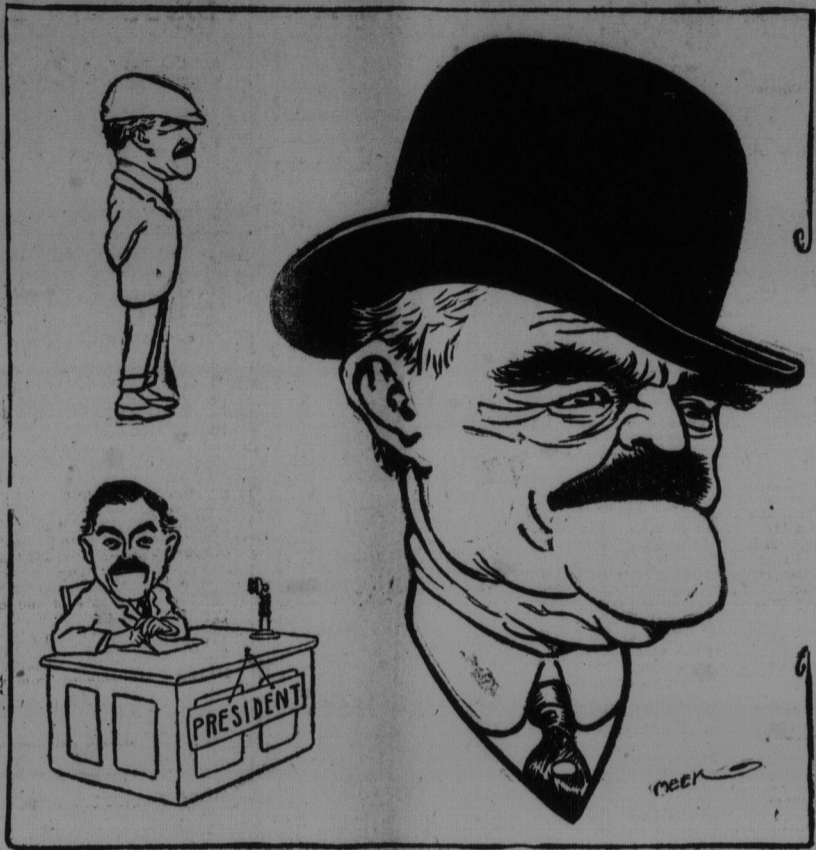
JACQUET RIVER WINS FROM BATHURST 2-1
