A grim story of hardship and peril, inferno, and the waves hissed and is contained in a letter received here yesterday by the relatives of Walter McDonald, the second engineer of the fill-fated steamship Parisiana, which was burned and abandoned by her crew, while on a voyage from Australia to New York last January. Mr. McDonald, who has many friends here gives a graphic description of the burning of the steamer, the sufferings of the crew in open boats, and their subsequent adventures on a desert is-land where they spent 28 days and mearly died of starvation, before being rescued by a British transport.

The Parisiana was in the Southern Pacific, when the fire was discovered. It started in the coal bunkers, and though the crew made a hard flight to subdue it, it developed rapidly, the heated plates setting fire to her cargo in the holds which consisted largery of wool.

While fighting the fire in the bunkers, one of the fremen named Tait, lost his life. He had entered one of the bunkers when the coal suddenly crumbled beneath him and he fell to the bottom where, on account of the beat and smoke, it was impossible to render him any ald.

A Raging inferno.

So rapidly did the fiames spread that when it was decided to abandon the slip the fire had already reached the storeroom, and the boats had to leave with very little food. When they put off the ship had a heavy list, and the flames were leaping from her hatches, making an awful picture of havoc and confusion as she wallowed in the huge swells then running. By that time the ship was a raging to America.
