

FORTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

—OF THE—

Managing Committee of Knox Church

FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1890.

Your Committee are pleased to report that the past year has been one of continued prosperity, the ordinary collections exceeding those of last year by \$272.94, while the special collection falls below last year by \$82.30. The following are the figures as taken from the Treasurer's report: Envelope collections, \$5592.54; loose collections, \$1049.44; mortgage debt collections, \$466.05; leaving a balance on hand of \$358.83, after paying off \$1000 on mortgage debt and \$1358.13 for church improvements. The number of subscribers by envelope are 468, giving the sum of \$114.10 per Sabbath, an increase over last year of 10 subscribers and \$3.33 per Sabbath. The arrears by envelope are \$197.95.

Your Committee, acting upon instructions received at the last congregational meeting, proceeded early in the year to make the necessary alterations and repairs to the church property, for which the above mentioned sum has been paid.

Your Committee express the hope, that the work of the Managers in this respect has met with the approval of the congregation and that the repairs are such as will preserve and beautify the church property.

Your Committee would recommend only one collection be taken up this year for the reduction of the mortgage debt, and that one on the second Sabbath in October.
