

RELIGIOUS CHURCHES OF IRELAND.—When the special census of Ireland was taken in 1854, with the object of ascertaining the religious persuasions of the people, it was found that out of a population of 7,954,760, there were Roman Catholics, 6,550,000; members of the Established Church, 1,000,000; Methodists, 853,169; Presbyterians, 643,058; other Dissenters, 21,532. The present return gives the Methodists, separately, as numbering 44,532. If we add this number to the members of the Established Church in the census of 1851, we shall have 723,192. Comparing this figure with the returns of 1854, we obtain the following results:—During the generation that has passed since that census, the population of Ireland has diminished by 2,130,217; the Roman Catholic population by 1,945,477; the Church of England population (including the Methodists) by 129,867; the Presbyterians by 114,666. The other Protestant denominations have been diminished about one-half.

BRIBERY AT ELECTIONS.—Both the candidates for Wakefield, at the general election in 1859, have been convicted of bribery by juries of their countrymen. It was the Conservative candidate, Mr. J. C. D. Charlesworth, who had escaped this degradation, as he escaped it at the spring assizes, in consequence of a principal witness Mr. Fernandez, having refused to answer questions which bore upon the bribery. For his contumacious Mr. Fernandez was committed to prison, and moreover, fined £500. This punishment produced its effect, for the recent trial at York, Mr. Fernandez, who looked pale and ill, from the effects of his long confinement, was much more communicative, and said and proved enough to secure Mr. Charlesworth's conviction. In the way of example these prosecutions and convictions will do good, and commend the really guilty parties—the candidates who furnish the money when it is judiciously squandered in a corrupt manner—the principal offenders are reached; but the process is painfully circuitous, and involves an expenditure that is deterring. The defendants will not be brought up for judgment before November, and considerable curiosity will be awakened to know the extent and the manner of the punishment. It would be a strange sight to see a barrister and a banker sentenced to hard labor for corrupting the electoral morals of the people; but judges have a great tendency to mercy in cases where the offenders are men of wealth and position.—*Wilder and Smith's Times.*

MELANCHOLY CASUALTY.—It is with feelings of heartfelt sorrow that we have to announce one of the most melancholy accidents that ever occurred in Brantford. Two daughters of A. L. Wilson, Esq., High Constable of the County, Fanny and Emma, aged thirteen and eleven years, were on a visit on Tuesday last with their mother, to Mrs. Skinner, residing near the Grand River a short distance south of Brantford. The two girls went down to the river to bathe, where the current, though not deep, is very rapid. The elder girl, as we are informed, crossed the stream, and called upon her sister to follow. In attempting to cross the little girl fell. The older sister rushed to rescue her, when she too was borne down by the current, and both, and to say, were drowned. The bodies of both were recovered, the one on the afternoon when the sad occurrence took place, and the other the next morning. The unfortunate girls were intelligent beyond their age, exceedingly attractive and interesting, which must add to the severity of the parental bereavement. The two Misses Wilson were the grand daughters of the Rev. W. Byerson, M. P. P. for West Brant.—*Brant Expressor.*

An elderly man was found dead a few mornings ago in one of the stables attached to the Grand Hotel, Quebec. A post-mortem examination was made by Dr. Parker, from which it appeared that there was considerable enlargement in the heart, and a stone much larger than a pigeon's egg, was found in the gall bladder. The surgeons gave it as their decided opinion at the inquest that deceased died from the enlargement of the heart and other natural causes. From papers found on his person it appears that the name of the deceased was Wm. R. Lloyd, and that he had been at one period a school teacher.

SUNSTROKE.—On the afternoon of Friday last, as Mr. Henderson was returning from Blandford to his residence at Cedar Creek, he was struck down by a short distance out of the village of Plattville. Being discovered about six o'clock, lying by the roadside in a state of insensibility, he was carried to Charles Taylor's Hotel, where, notwithstanding the careful attendance of Dr. Morrison, of Plattville, and Dr. Cav, of Ayr, he died next morning.—*Ayr Observer.*

On Tuesday evening last a person named Blanchard was attacked on Brook street, Montreal, by scoundrels who knocked him down, tore his mouth and clothes, and robbed him of a silver watch of the value of \$10, and a gold chain worth \$5. John O'Rourke and Bob Windsor have been arrested, charged with being the parties. O'Rourke has confessed to the assault and theft, affirming that Windsor was with him at the time of the committal.

Mr. Leonard Sedgwick's dwelling house, on the fourth line of Smith, was burned to the ground on Sunday afternoon; everything in the dwelling was consumed with it. Mr. Sedgwick's servant girl has been arrested on the charge of wilfully setting the house on fire.
