Tariff Discussion Is Postponed

DECLARED THAT IT IS PROBABLE THAT ONE OR MORE QUEBEC MEN WILL BE ADDED TO THE MINISTRY

Ottawa, March 12.—The tariff is not likely to be before Parliament for a considerable time yet. A caucus fixed to-night for March 20, will be assigned particularly for its discussion and in the light of the counsel given then the Cabinet will use its discretion, but it is intimated that the final decision will await the return of the premier and his colleagues from the peace conference. They are expected about April 10.

The budget is not expected to be brought down before the end of April. The interval between the caucus and the budget when tariff changes are announced will afford abundant time for a discussion of what is to enter into and what concessions, if any are to be made. The tariff is not held to be inviolate. It must be revised but there is a widely prevalent view in the West, though contested by the East, that the present is not opportune for dealing with the matter.

At the slow rate Parliament is proceeding apparently with some measure of design, the premier will be back before the more vital phases of the sessional program are entered upon.

Cabinet Reconstruction. Reconstruction of the Cabinet is another matter which Sir Robert Borden will take up when he returns from Paris. Some interesting rumors are afoot with regard to Quebec's representation. There is only one French minister now, Hon. P.E. Borden and his seat is in the Senate.

Not a single French minister is in the Commons while for this situation Quebec has only itself to blame. It is recognized that the interest of the country a greater representation is desirable.

Interesting rumors are afloat that in the reorganization which is coming efforts will be made to bring in not French-Canadians who supported the Union Government—there were a few—but to broaden the scope so as to include certain leaders of the present Opposition in Parliament who represent Quebec constituencies.

Awaits Premier's return. The move is apparently originating more from the outside than in, can take form only when Sir Robert Borden returns, as in such matters he is the master of the ship. Where it accomplished the Union Government would take on more of the mould and form of a coalition.

It is represented with the war over description of the statute and Sir Wilfrid Dene. Quebec's sentiment is not as strong as it was. That the change is sufficient however, to bring about what is talked of, admits of doubt but the subject is being discussed. In any event there will be one or two more French ministers from that province.

Such a development would not only equalize the representation in the Cabinet but it would give Quebec a proper voice in the determination of the grave questions of economic policy which are before the Government and in relation to which the province's interests are vital. They are very similar to those of Ontario.

Steps To Be Taken Regarding Port Dover

MUNICIPALITIES TO ACT

Brantford, March 12.—Immediate steps will be taken to bring pressure to bear upon the Government from all of the municipalities of the Grand River valley for the development of Port Dover harbor. It is proposed to hold a meeting of representatives from these cities in Brantford at an early date and bring about an organization to obtain action on the question of a lake port. The Chamber of Commerce here is making the necessary arrangements.

Committees will also be appointed to urge the immediate construction of the provincial highway in and out of Brantford, and to endeavor to secure new industries.

Community Labor Board. Organization of a community labor board is being planned here. With such it would be possible to bring about an exchange of opinions between the employer and the men particularly the returned soldiers who are seeking employment. The problem of the re-establishment of soldiers is becoming more difficult as the number of men coming home increases and such a board would aid in solving the problems. One employed of labor in large numbers remarked, this morning that the best workmen where physical conditions permitted were those who had been to France.

BRITISH WOMEN IN WAR WORK

London, March 5.—The vast extent to which British women replaced men in industry and commerce during the war is disclosed in a White Paper issued to-day. Not only did the number of women ordinarily employed show an increase, but more than a million and a half additional came forward to take the place of the men. Making all necessary deductions and additions, it is estimated that the net increase in female workers employed outside their own homes was 1,200,000.

The number of women employed in industrial concerns and Government establishments in April, 1918 were: Munitions, 701,000; other Government work in industry, 774,000.
