Descended from the Le Vescontes of Saint Sauveur Le Vesconte in Normandy, afterwards Lords of the Manor of St. Germain. Jersey. S. of Peter Le Vesconte, Esq., of St. Heliers, in the Island of Jersey, merchant, by Jane Malzard, his wife. B. at St. Aubins, Jersey. 12 Augt, 1822. Ed. at St. Helie's Parsonage House Academy. M. at Arichat, 1843, Caroline Susan, dau. of John Jean, Esq., Collector of H. M. Customs, and s. of Philip Jean, Esq., *Neigneur* of "Couvéés," Jersey. Is a Lieut. Col. in the N. S. Militia, and Spanish Consular Agent at Arichat. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, N.S., and Financial Secretary of that Province from 1863 to 1865; represented N. S. on the Commission sent by the B. N. A. Provinces in 1864 to open trade relations with the West Indies, Mexico and Brazil. Sat for Richmond in N. S. Assembly from 1863 until the Union. First returned to Commons, Apl., 1869, for present seat,
