XXV. the full amount of all rates and charges due thereon.

XXVI. And be it enacted, That on payment by any Proprietor 15 purchaser under this Act of the sum declared to be may take demanded in respect of any lot or parcel of land so sold within 12 as aforesaid, the Secretary-Treasurer shall give him a nonths of his land sold, on certificate under his hand specifying the particulars certain conof such sale, and the purchaser may forthwith enter ditions. 20 upon and take possession of such lot or parcel of land; but if within twelve calendar months from the time of such sale the proprietor of the lot or any one on his behalf, shall pay to the Secretary-Treasurer the amount levied, together with twenty per centum in addition 25 to the same, then he shall be entitled to receive possession of the lot or parcel of land so sold, and the Secretary-Treasurer shall on demand pay to the purchaser thereof, his heirs, assigns or representatives, the full amount received by him from the original proprietor, and the 30 right acquired by such purchaser shall thenceforth wholly cease and determine.

XXVII. And be it enacted, That if, at the expiration If land is not of twelve calendar months from the time of such adjudi- adjudged after cation, the land so adjudged shall not be redeemed as 35 aforesaid, then the Secretary-Treasurer for the time being shall, on demand by the purchaser, his heirs, assigns of representatives, and on receiving from him or them the arrears of any other rates which may have become due thereon in the mean time, if not previously 40 paid, execute a deed of sale in due form of law, to such purchaser, his heirs or legal representatives; and such deed of sale shall be a legal title and shall confer on such purchaser, his heirs or legal representatives, the same rights in regard to such lot or parcel of land as a title 45 ratified and confirmed by a Court of Law.

XXVIII.
