Man who shot 2 gets 4 years

Robert Curnoe, the man who faced a life sentence for the shooting of two men at Mississauga's Avion Motor Hotel, was sentenced to four years in penitentiary in Peel County Court Wednesday

The sentence wrapped up a dramatic eight-day trial in which Curnoe told police he would be "gunned down in court" by friends of his victims. The Supreme Court jury took six hours to reach a verdict of guilty of attempted murder and guilty of shooting with intent to endanger life

Curnoe, a Weston mechanic who owned his own business and acted as unofficial bouncer at the Avion, told court he had been threatened by patrons at the hotel and feared for his life. Just six days before the Dec. 23, 1978 shooting he purchased a 38 calibre revolver for protection.

Defence attorney Paul Tomlinson maintained that Jeffery Myron, 23, and Michael Lance 19, made threatening gestures to the accused, and Curnoe, fearing they were part of a gang plot to "get him" shot Lance in the face and

approached him.

Before sentencing, Curnoe told Mr. Justice A. W. Maloney, "At no time did I attempt to lie of deceive this court. This whole world is just going crazy,

In passing sentence, Justice Maloney said Curnoe was "crying out for calamity" by walking around a crowded tavern with a loaded revolver.


'If you had been threatened you could have spared confrontation by simply staying away from the Avion's Leaky Tap Tavern," he said.

"I find it difficult to accept that you did what you did, but I am impressed with your background and I am convinced that you feel true remorse.

"I impose a four-year sentence because the public must know the courts will not countenance such conduct.

Crown attorney Leo McGuigan, who commended Curnoe for an "academy performance" on the witness stand, argued for a stiff sentence. "it's a miracle it's not two counts of murder this man is

facing," he said. "Curnoe shot two people down like dogs, and one of the men is partially deaf and both will bear emotional scars for
