

Amherstburg 28<sup>th</sup> June 1820.

Sir

I have the honor to enclose to you a Copy taken from the original in Chief Harkin's hand writing of the Prospector's Speech against me delivered in the Chief's quarters in presence of Captain Reed and Mr Jackson. I was informed of their Meeting by the Chief and attended at his Quarters, on the subject they leave to refer you to my letter of the 22<sup>nd</sup> ultimo wherein I stated the basis on which I had been informed he intended to erect the Superstructure and his astonishment at my Appointment without his knowledge.

As far as relates to the late Superintendent, the intimacy and brotherly friendship; which has subsisted between him and me for upwards of 30 years, as is well known here to all who know us both, will meet any thing the Prospector states of my
