Referencing to the complaints  
of our clients, the Chippawa  
Indian and Wolf Lake bands, concerning which  
we have had the honor of corresponding  
with you to the effect that your Depart-  
ment allowed our treaty Indians to  
share in their annuity. I have we  
have learned that the proposed legis-  
lation under which a commission could  
be appointed to enquire into the matter  
was not passed at the last session.  
The matter therefore appears to be in  
statu quo. Will you please inform  
us whether you will have the matter  
enquired into, under the law as  
it stands. If nothing is done,  
our clients propose to proceed against  
the government by petition of right.  
An early reply will oblige
