RETABLISHMENT OF A POUND AND THE APPOINTMENT OF A POUND-KEEPER

ON THRIR RESERVE

1. It shall not be lawful for the cattle, horses, mules, sheep or pigs of other than a member of this band to ream at large, feed or pasture upon any portion of the Reserve, except such as are placed upon the reserve for grazing with the knowledge and consent of the Indian Agent, and any anisal so found unlawfully reasing at large, feeding or pasturing may be in ounded and dealt with as provided in the following sections:-

2. The Indian Agent or some one appointed by him shall be poundkeeper for the reserve.

3. The pound-keeper shall keep a book in which he shall record a description of all animals impounded, with the date of impounding, damage claimed, date redeemed or sold, and disposal of the proceeds.

4. Any one finding any animal on the reserve, reasing at large, feeding or grazing, in contravention of the foregoing section 1, may deliver same to the pound, whether the owner of such animal be known or not.

5. The pound-keeper shall, within two days after the impounding of any animal, have notices posted in at least three conspicuous places on or adjoining the reserve; if the owner of the impounded animal is known, notice of impounding such animal shall be forwarded to such owner.

6. Sufficient grazing and feed shall be provided for animals

7. The owner of an animal in said pound may redoom such animal by the payment of free as hereinafter provided.

8. When an animal has not be released from the pound within twenty days after the notice has been posted as provided for in Section 5, the said animal shall be sold by public suction after notice of such sale has been posted eight days in three conspicuous places within reasonable distance of stid pound; and at such sale, the pound-keeper, a justice of the peace, or licensed suctioneer, chosen by the Indian Agent shall ben the auctioneer, and such sale shall be held at the pound and shall commence at two o'clock in the afternoon.
