Very heavy wind today and dual instruction only being carried out. Flying Officer W. Abercromby is at Edmonton completing tests. The Station Australian football team were defeated by the Drumheller Team at Mewata Stadium 7 - 0.	
	18-5-41		The band attended church parade today and played the hymns for the first time. Flying washed out during the day but night flying continued as usual. Anson No. W2130 arrived from Toronto being added to the strength of this Station.	
	19-5-41		Squadron Leader K. Gray (Armament Officer, No. 4 T.C.) visited the Station. Anson No. 1947, pilot LAC J. Parsons had a forced landing near Shepherd, Alberta. The aircraft was considerably damaged but no injury to personnel.	
	20-5-41		Squadron Leader K. Gray (Armament Officer No. 4 T.C.) gave a lecture to all pilots on operational armament. Anson 6197, pilot LAC A.L. Newton had forced landing two miles south of Hubalta, Alberta. Aircraft undamaged and was flown back to the Station later. International Harvester Company have loaned a power mower to the Station to be used in cutting the grass on the aerodrome.
