sider the merits of the proposed measure but to consider personal grudges and party advantage instead of the good to be accomplished where in other states these measures have passed by Republican and Democrats irrespectively, in Colorado the employes have so often supported the Democratic party that a great many conservative Democrats have gone over to the Republicans and the more progressive Republicans have voted with the Democrats, so that a partizan line up is often drawn on these measures a situation that I believe is peculiar to this state.
