I have a young friend by the name of Mahlon Sanford who, since his graduation from Toronto University as an electrical engineer, has been employed with a Power Company in the East. Some months ago his mother was ill and it was thought she would not recover. He went home to Calgary and as a consequence he has lost his position. Would you be good enough to let me know whether there would be any possibility whatever of young Sanford being taken on with the Hydro Development in Ontario.

I can assure you I will not appeal to you on behalf of any of the other first hundred thousand who are asking me to secure employment for them, but in this one case I am very anxious. If there is any chance at all for young Sanford, I will get you complete particulars about him.
