- Q92. - You lay on the accused bed?
- A92. - Yes, sir.
- Q93. - Undressed first?
- A93. - I undressed.
- Q94. - You were dressed when you came into the Orderly Room for the last time?
- A94. - Yes sir. I came in, went over to my bed, took two blankets over to Sgt JOHNSON's bed.
- Q95. - Then what happened?
- A95. - I gave the blankets to Sgt JOHNSON.
- Q96. - He was in bed?
- A96. - He was on the bed but not lying down.
- Q97. - You came into the office three times, where was Sgt JOHNSON?
- A97. - On the bed.
- Q98. - Was he lying down?
- A98. - He was making the bed on the floor.
- Q99. - Was he dressed?
- A99. - Only in his underclothes.
