

quote from the Dominion Government Experimental Station report: "Alfalfa alone produced 4 tons, 820 lbs.; with grasses, 5 tons, 320 lbs. per acre. Clover alone, 5 tons, 1880 lbs.; with grasses, 6 tons, 1260 lbs. per acre. Potatoes, Wee Macgregor variety, 19.6 tons per acre. Peas, 48 bushels per acre. Carrots, 27.7 tons per acre." The District is comparatively well settled. There is an extensive range for cattle and horses, most of which is available for settlement.

The valley is well watered by the following rivers: Columbia, Horse Thief, Toby, Dutch, Findlay and Kootenay. Ample water has been obtained from these and other creeks for two large, and numerous other smaller irrigation systems, on which much land is still available for settlement.

Annual shows are held by the local Agricultural Society and Farmers' Institute, and there is also a branch of the B. C. Stockbreeders' Association.
