subjects for consideration, maty he lnought before the meetings of the association, and may receive papers from strangers.
4. Any paper read before the association and deemed worthy of preservation or publication shall, with the consent of the unthor, be placed at the disposal of the council.

## III.-MOIDE OF ELECTION.

The Offee-bearers and Committee shall be elected in the following mamer, after niva voce nomination : Each member shall write the name of the person he selects for the office, and put the paper, withont signature, in the hallot box. The Secretaries, of two Scrutincers, sperially apminted, shall report the mumber of votes fir ach mominere, and the prown having the majonity of botes slath be clectent. In ease there are more than two nomineses fir one oflice, and no ome has a majority of the total number of votes, the one having the smallest mmbin of votes shall he struck off the list, and a fresh ballot taken.

## N.-MEETIN(iN.

At the ordinary meotings, the l'resident shall take the chair at the appointed hour, or as soon thereatter as five members aro present, and the following order of hosiness shatl be ohserved.

1. Reading, amending if neressary, and sanctioning the minutes of last meeting.
2. 'Transaction of any business arising out of the minutes, or lying over from the last mecting.
3. Motions, and balloting, for the admission of new members.
4. Introduction (by any member) of visitors to the meeting.
5. Announcement by the Corresponding Secretary of letters, papers, or other documents received siner lant meeting-and reading such of them as maty be desived.
6. Report by the President of donations to the librury or Musenm.
7. Reading, and remarks on; assays and papers.
8. Amouncing, as far is practicable, the business for next meeting.
