Also a Message from the Council acquainting the House that they had agreed to the Bill to continue and make perpetual an Act passed in the S9th year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Fisheries in the County of Northumberland," with an amendment—which being read, was agreed to. Ordered, that the Bill be returned to the Council.

Also a Message from the Council acquainting the House that Mr. Chipman is appointed a Committee to manage the conference, on the part of the Council, on the subject of the Bill for the recovery of small debts.

Read a second time, a Bill to authorise the crection of fences and gates across certain roads in the several Counties in this Province where the same shall be found necessary. Ordered, that the said Bill be committed.

Read a second time, a Bill for making the river Oromocto a lawful fence from its mouth or entrance, to the upper line of Capt. Hiel Camp's lands in Lincoln. Ordered, that the said Bill be committed.

Read a second time, a Bill to continue an Act, intituled "An Act to prevent illicit and clandestine trade, and for imposing a duty upon articles illegally imported or brought into this Province, to be levied and paid after the condemnation and sale thereof." Ordered, that the said Bill be committed.

Mr. M. Donald brought in by leave, a Bill to continue and amend, an Act intituled "An Act for the support and relief of confined Debtors;" which was read a first time.

The House then Adjourned until to-morrow morning at 10 o'Clock.
