## WATER MAIN EXTENSIONS

Ald. Austin Suggests They Be Placed on Every Street

Many Matters Come Before The City Council Meeting

The meeting of the City Council last night was a short one, but quite an amount of business was transacted during the one and one-half hours session. All the members were present with the exception of Aldermen Kerr, Massey and Westman.

A communication was received stating that the M. H. O. and the chairman of the Board of Works recommended the construction of a sewer on Hyslop street, between Park avenue and Duke street. On motion of Ald. Bensen and Ald. Stephens, a vote was passed that the work be gone on with.

A tender was received from Mr. Harris, who offered to level the boulevards on Adelaide street for the sum of fifteen dollars.—Board of Works.

Clara M. Martin, barrister, solicitor, of Toronto, wrote, asking for information regarding a Mrs. Crow and a Mrs. Fordham, daughters of the late Daniel Fordham, whom she claimed had one time lived in Chatham. The Mayor said that he knew nothing about the people and referred the matter to the press.

A complaint re prices charged for natural gas, which was received from James Cameron, of Park avenue, was referred to the Gas Committee.

The Warren Bituminous Company wrote stating that they had received a letter from Blight & Fielder, in which the latter company drew attention to the fact that Fire Chief Pritchard had notified them that they must take down the barricades protecting the freshly-laid concrete on the approach to Fifth street bridge. In this case, the company wished to state that they would not be responsible for any damage done to the pavement.—Received.

The Warren Company by letter also drew attention to the damage which traction engines passing through the city have been doing to the pavement laid by them. They suggested that the City Council pass a by-law prohibiting these engines from passing over paved streets, or under the wheels while they are going over streets paved with bituminous material.—Referred to Board of Works.

The chairman of the Parks and Cemeteries committee of the City Council of Guelph wrote asking for facts regarding receiving vaults in Chatham.

The Le Canadian French newspaper asked to be given a share of the civic advertising matter.

The Canadian Independent Telephone Association, with headquarters at Toronto, asked for a donation of five dollars from the Chatham City Council, claiming that they are working in the interests of all Canadian cities and towns.

On motion of Ald. Austin and Ald. Potter, the request was granted.

The Finance committee, of which Ald. Austin is chairman, stated by report that they had looked into the assessment of James Graves, and they recommended that he receive a refund of \$218 per year for all years in which he has been over taxed through an error made by a former city engineer.—Adopted.

Thomas Buck wrote stating that the property owners on the west side of Payne street were in bad need of a sidewalk.—Board of Works.

**INQUIRIES.**

Ald. Bullis inquired as to when the construction of a new sidewalk was to begin on St. George street. This thoroughfare, he said, was badly in need of a walk. He also pointed out that a walk should be constructed on the north side of Wellington street, between Adelaide and William streets. The ratpayers there, he stated, were well able to pay for a walk.

The Mayor asked the chairman of the Property committee to see that the matter of another fire alarm box on St. George street is promptly attended to.

The Mayor inquired as to what the Board of Works were doing with regard to the construction of the proposed sidewalk near the wheel works.

Ald. Maynell drew attention to the bad piece of sidewalk at the corner of King and Third streets, near the power house.

Ald. Potter drew attention to the fact that a sewer on Grey street, between Raleigh and Queen streets, is blocked and should receive immediate attention.—Board of Works.
