Returned Soldier's Insurance Act

All returned soldiers and their families will be interested in the Returned Soldiers' Insurance Act, under which they are provided with an opportunity of obtaining Life Insuran ce at most favourable rates. The Act became effective on September 1st. 1920, and will remain in force for

two years.
Under the provisions of the Act any honorably discharged soldier sallor, or nurse, of the Canadian Forces domiciled and resident in Canada may insure with the Government to an amount of from \$500.00 to \$5,000. 00. Under certain conditions the dow of a returned soldier, who died subsequent to discharge, may al-

so obtain insurance.
In addition to former members the C. E. F., the privileges of the Act are available to anyone, male or female who served during the late War in the Imperial Army or with the Forces of any of the allied or associated powers, providing they were domiciled and resident in Canada be fore the War and hold an honourable

discharge.

Many of those who served overseas. while not suffering from a severe disability, find that condition is such that they are unable to obtain life insurance at all or only at much higher rates than are normally demanded. They, therefore
